# What changes in middle school?

- From 1 teacher and classroom to 4 different teachers and 4 classrooms
- From 60-90 peers in the same grade to 450 peers in the same grade coming from 7 elementary schools in the Kennedy attendance area
- No recess
- 4 minutes of "passing period" to switch classes
- PE daily, including changing clothes in the locker room each day
- 6th grade wheel classes or Band or Core Support (RSP)

#### Wheel Classes

- Academic Strategies
- Digital Citizenship
- Healthy Lifestyles
- Innovations

Wheel classes last one quarter. Students take all four classes in the wheel.

#### **Band**

- Beginning Band
- Advanced Band

Students stay in band for the entire year.

NOTE: Students in the RSP Program take Core Support instead of Wheel classes

# Supplies for the 1st Day

What does my child need for the first day:

- Something to write with
- Something to write on
- A backpack
- Their daily schedule (Online in Infinite Campus 8/11)

Teacher will tell students what supplies they need during the first week of school.

#### Pick up & Drop off

Before and after school pick up/drop off is a bit chaotic. I do my best to help direct traffic but I count on drivers to be diligent, safe, and calm. In the past few weeks I have noticed an increase in drivers not following procedures. Please review the rules below and reach out if you have any questions:

- 1. Do not drop off in a red zone.
- 2. Do not block driveways to drop off students.
- 3. Do not drop off in the middle of the street.
- 4. When exiting the loop if you are in the left lane, you must exit left, if you are in the right lane, you must exit right.
- 5. No student pick up or drop off in the staff parking lot unless you have been given admin permission.
- 6. Please remain calm and refrain from honking your horn or yelling at other drivers.
- 7. Watch out for pedestrians and bikers

You may consider arranging a spot a block away from school to pick up your student so that you miss the traffic. Please see the map below of the drop off loop.



#### **Dropping off forgotten items**

- Lunches, pencil boxes, classwork, projects or other non-essential items can be dropped off on the table outside the main office in the hallway
  - Students who have forgotten items like those listed above should look at the table during passing period to see if their families have dropped anything off
- Glasses or other essential items can be given to office staff so they can be given to students

# Biking/skateboarding/scootering to School

- Students who bike to school must wear a helmet
- Bikes/skateboards/scooters can be locked in one of the two bike racks at Walters
  - One is located next to the main office
  - One is located by the drop off/pick up look on logan by the new building
- Bikes/skateboards/scooters must be walked once on campus
- Students must bring their own locks

#### **Visiting School**

- Make an appointment with whomever you would like to meet with
- Check in at the hallway office window
- Do not come to visit the school if you have cold like symptoms
- All visitors enter the school through the front double doors in the hallway and check in at the window.
- Visitors must have a visitors pass




Henna Club is meeting in the Art room after school on Friday for the last meeting.


