FROM THE DESK OF THE ASSISTANT PRINCIPAL

The first semester has come to a close. Can you believe we are already half-way through the 2022-2023 school year? Families, please take the time to review your student's grades which can be found in the Illuminate Parent Portal. Celebrate the successes, because we all know how important it is to acknowledge the positive. If your student is struggling, the good news is the second semester offers a fresh start for everyone. Please reach out to the Centerville staff and your student's teachers if extra support is needed regarding your student's academics. We are here to support you and your student.

Students who have year-long electives (such as band or foreign language) remained in the same course, with the same teacher. Many other students had semester electives (such as leadership, drama, or art), which are different from the class they had during the first semester. Please take the time to reach out to any new teachers on your student's schedules if you have any questions or concerns.

Every student is expected to attend every class period, every day. Research shows that missing 10 percent of school days, or about 18 days in most school districts, negatively affects a student's academic performance. That's just two days a month and known as chronic absence. Students who are chronically absent have lower reading and math scores, as well as weaker social-emotional skills than they need to persist in school. If your student is experiencing issues that are preventing them from attending school daily, please contact the front office so we can provide support to ensure your student comes to school daily. Some strategies for parents to consider are: talking with your student, contacting the school, making sure there is not an underlying issue preventing your student from doing well in their classes, and setting attendance goals with your student.

Springtime is just around the corner. This means there will be dances and end of the year activities. End of Year Activities for 8th graders include: The Great America Trip, the Promotion Dance, and the 8th Grade BBQ. There will also be dances, lunch time activities and our Round-Up Day Carnival for 7th/8th graders. Along with these upcoming activities and better weather, we also start the restricted list. This is the list of students who will not be eligible to participate in the exciting, upcoming activities. Any student who receives more than three RC or student discipline referrals to the assistant principal or is suspended in the RC or off campus for a partial or full day, during the third and fourth quarter, will be placed on the restricted list. The restricted list students will lose the opportunity to participate in one or more upcoming activities. The good news is your student will have the opportunity to start over at the beginning of the fourth quarter, March 16th, if they are on the restricted list during the third quarter. Please remind your student that behavior is important and all school rules must be followed. We understand that spring will be in the air, but we must all work together to keep our campus a safe, happy, and healthy place for everyone.

Please review the school wide rules regarding technology, with your students. Students should not be on their cell phones from the first to last bell of the school day. Having a clear expectation on the proper use of electronics is especially important during the middle school years, as they build lifetime habits. Parents, please remember to check your student's messages, as there have been numerous reports of students inappropriately using social media platforms to send harmful messages to each other.

Student of the Quarter

Our faculty and staff want to honor students that are the embodiment of what it means to be a Mustang. Someone that perseveres, works hard, and has strong character traits.

This year Centerville Faculty and Staff will be implementing a Student of the Quarter Award. At the end 1st, 2nd, and 3rd quarter we will be implementing this award. For each of our first three quarters, each teacher may submit one name as their Student of the Quarter. Teachers have agreed on

the following criteria for choosing the "Student of the Quarter":

- Students exhibiting excellent character traits (Planning and Decision Making, Honesty, Integrity, Responsibility, Citizenship, Respect for Others, Caring, Problem Solving)
- Students that have significantly improved (academically, socially/emotionally, behaviorally)
- Students who have excellent academics, excellent behavior, or excellent participation in class.

Students nominated will receive a certificate and a bumper sticker designating them as a Student of the Quarter. Students will also be invited to a Zoom session for the Principal and/or Assistant Principal to present the award.

Each teacher decides which student will receive the award. Students and/or parents should not lobby teachers for an award. Please feel free to ask Principal Lewis or Assistant Principal Grimmer if you should have any questions.



CAASPP

California Assessment of Student Performance and Progress (CAASPP) is the state academic testing program intended to provide information that can be used to monitor student progress and ensure that all students leave high school ready for college and career. Students who have the most significant cognitive disabilities, as designated in their active individualized education program, are eligible to take the California Alternative Assessments (CAAs). Students in grades 3-8 and 11 will take either the computer adaptive CAASPP or CAAs in English and Math. In addition, students in grade 5, 8, and 12 will take California Science Test (CAST) in spring 2021.

Parents/guardians have the right to exempt their child (ren) from taking the CAASPP, CAAs, and/or CAST. For more information about your school's schedule or concerns about your child's participation, please contact your school.

ELPAC TESTING

The Summative English Proficiency Assessments for California, or Summative ELPAC, is the test used to measure how well students understand English when it is not the language they speak at home. Information from the ELPAC tells your child's teacher about the areas in which your child needs extra support. This spring, your child will take the Summative ELPAC.

Students in kindergarten through grade twelve who are classified as English learners will take the Summative ELPAC every year until they are reclassified as proficient in English. Students are tested on their skills in listening, speaking, reading, and writing. Your child's voice is being recorded as part of the speaking test. A small percentage of student responses will be used to validate the accuracy of scoring and will not be used for identification. All recorded responses will be destroyed after the scores are validated.


Counselor's Corner

Student Data

During the fall semester, we began using our self-referral form for students to have more access to their school counselor for academic, social emotional, and college/career support. The majority of students who make appointments with us for academic purposes, while the majority of our drop-in students have been for social emotional support. Since we started collecting this data, we have seen 380 students through appointments and 140 students through drop-ins.
