Follow up with student goals and help students track and achieve targets consistently. Have students reflect about their growth as a student and areas they are doing well and ways to improve.	Communicate high expectations for learning, ensure students get adequate sleep, nutrition and attendance, while helping students reach goals.	Set academic goals and track your progress on School Loop while challenging yourself.
Accessibility And Communication	Help students take responsibility for their learning and encourage families to participate in Back to School Night, parent-teacher conferences, and maintain frequent communication home through BrightArrow and SchoolLoop.	Provide each student with access to School loop, establish student study teams, COST, provide interpreters and be available for parents and students when needed.	Stay informed and participate in student's education by checking School Loop, checking BrightArrow messages, volunteering in the classroom and in school activities.	Ask for help when needed, and be open and honest with teachers and parents regarding academic growth.
School Involvement	Motivate families to attend school events and provide various opportunities for parent participation.	Notify and solicit help from parents to be a part of School Site Counsel, PTA and Merit Club and include parents and community in the creation of school's parent involvement policy, inviting families to attend Title I meetings.	Attend Academic Family Nights, Student Study Team meetings, Open House, Parent/Teacher Conferences, and serve on school advisory groups.
