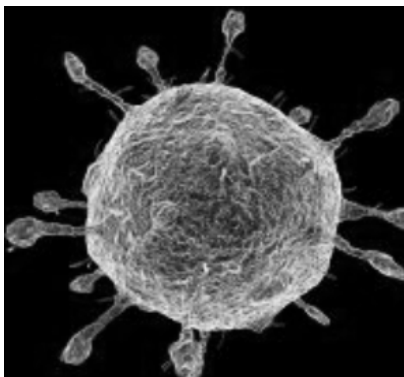

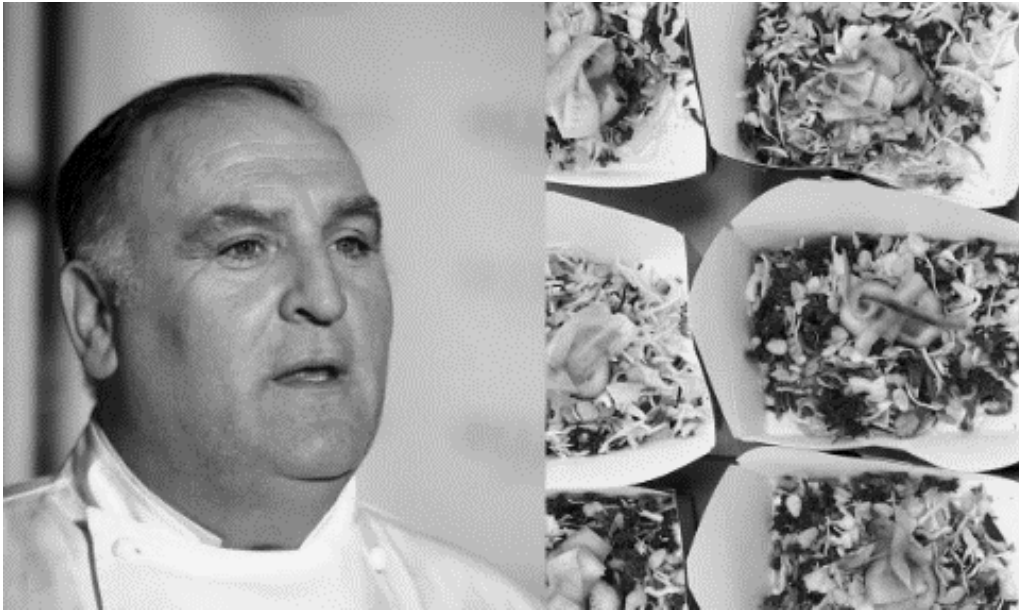

Chef Andres continues feeding those in need worldwide

Jose Andres is an example to follow in helping those in need internationally. Jose Andres is a Spanish- American Chef who owns a charity named *World Central Kitchen* that provides non-profit meals to those going through natural disasters. He has been serving meals since 2010, when he formed his charity. Andres has 31 eateries as well as *World Central Kitchen*.

Currently, he is working hard to provide fresh meals for the *Grand Princess Cruise* and *Diamond Princess Cruise* guests, some of whom are infected with the coronavirus. It was reported by *Cnn.com*, that there are about 21 guests who have been tested positive for COVID-19. The *Grand Princess Cruise* had been at sea since March 4, but had finally docked at the Port of Oakland on March 9.

Although a 7th grader, Muhammed Naem, claimed that Chef Andres could get sick and spread the virus to those who haven't been infected by giving them meals. He believes that even Jose's helpers may get the coronavirus and drastically

affect the people around them.

Due to the crisis, *Princess.com* stated, "I wish to advise you that today we have been notified by the United States Centers for Disease Control and Prevention that they are investigating a small cluster of COVID-19 (coronavirus) cases in Northern California connected to our previous *Grand Princess* voyage."

Chef Andres is providing meals for 2,500 passengers, as well as 1,000 crew members. Andres has spent his time and money serving millions of meals so far.

Amanda Herrera, in 8th grade, explained, "Jose is doing a good thing to provide meals for the passengers, especially those infected with the coronavirus."

Maizy Moisselle, from 6th grade, stated, "I would help Jose if I could, although I would take precautions because I wouldn't want to get the virus."

It is this work for which Andres has earned respects from the culinary world and beyond.

New car-sized asteroid found orbiting earth every 47 days

Earth has picked up a new, temporary moon. Invisible to the naked eye, the asteroid was discovered on January 15 at the Catalina Sky Survey in Arizona. It has been named 2020 CD3, and scientists have calculated that it has been gravitationally bound to Earth for about 3 years.

It is roughly the size of a car and orbits our planet about every 47 days. Its path is wide and oval-shaped, usually taking it past the bigger moon's orbit. 2020 CD3 is the 2nd known asteroid to orbit Earth; 2006 RH120 having appeared between September of 2006 and June of 2007. However, 2020 CD3's orbit is not stable.

"It is heading away from the Earth-moon system as we speak," stated Grigori Fedorets at Queen's University Belfast in the UK, according to *news scientist.com*. It will probably escape Earth's gravity by April. Although, several scientists disagree about it's true trajectory, and some say it is not a temporary moon, but just some artificial space debris.
