Dear Ardenwood Families,

With the arrival of the month of March, Ardenwood Elementary is excited to offer a variety of activities to students and their families on the topics of Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, Mathematics (STEAM) and Community Safety.

In partnership with the Fremont Fire Department, on the evening of March 29<sup>th</sup>, Ardenwood will be hosting a Personal Emergency Preparedness Course. This event is free, and includes complementary child care and dinner, to the first 75 attendees to register at <a href="www.tinyurl.com/ArdenwoodPEP19">www.tinyurl.com/ArdenwoodPEP19</a>. Our annual Golden Sneaker Contest starts at the end of this month and runs through March 8<sup>th</sup>. We encourage all families to participate putting into place the safety skills students have learned through our partnership with the Alameda County Safe Routes to School program.

Our focus on STEAM this month is due in part to March  $14^{th}$  being celebrated as Pi ( $\pi$ ) Day. For any size circle, the ratio of the circle's circumference to its diameter is always 3.14 (rounded to the nearest hundredths place). Students will be encouraged to compete in a Pi recitation competition, jointly judged by school staff and representatives from the Calculus Roundtable on March  $14^{th}$ . The Fremont Education Foundation will be hosting a Family Coding and Maker Night on March  $15^{th}$  here at Ardenwood in the MPR. # Registration for the 2019-2020 School Year

Sibling registration and priority enrollment for TK and Kindergarten students for the next school year has already passed. The next opportunity for enrollment for TK-6<sup>th</sup> grade will be April 1, 2019 and will be ongoing. # At What Age May My Child Start Kindergarten? Is My Child Eligible For TK?

*To be eligible for Kindergarten* for the **Fall 2019-2020** School Year, your child's birth date must fall between these dates: 09/02/13 - 09/01/14. Your child **must be five years old by September 1, 2019**. *To be eligible for TK (Transitional Kindergarten)* your child **must be turning 5 years old in 2019** and their birthday must be between these dates: 09/02/14 – 12/02/14. Students born after 12/02/14 are not eligible for TK and may attend Kindergarten the next school year beginning 2020-2021.

# Fall Registration/Residency Verification Forms for Continuing Students

The annual **Fall Registration/Residency Verification Forms** will be mailed home from FUSD to the parents/legal guardians of continuing students. Parents/legal guardians are to return the completed forms along with their required supporting documentation to the school site that their student attends. **Form and residency proofs are due to Ardenwood on or before the due date of 2/28/2019!** This includes TK and any students overloaded/attending here from other schools.

## 6<sup>th</sup> Grade Parent News

#### \*\*\* Tdap Immunization Requirement for 7th Grade \*\*\*

Students will not be allowed to attend classes in the Fall of 2019 without a shot record of a Tdap booster. Make an after school appointment for Tdap with your physician if your child has yet to have the immunization and turn in the supporting document(s) to the school office.

**Thornton Junior High School** Administrators are coming to Ardenwood to provide registration information and forms on February 28<sup>th</sup>. Students will bring their registration forms home for parent input and signatures. Students will be given a deadline for the forms to be returned to their respective sixth grade teacher.

The Math Test for 7th Grade Placement (formerly known as 6th Grade Math Placement Test) is now an online assessment. The test, made up of two parts, will be administered at schools between April 8 and April 17, 2019. Results from both parts of the test, along with district assessment results and 2 years of SBAC scores, will be considered for math placement in junior high and middle school. # **School Accountability Report Card**

Federal and state laws require school districts to make accountability reports available to the public online. Accountability report information is based on data and information from the previous year. Dates will run one year behind. We are pleased to inform you that our district's School Accountability Report Cards (SARCs) are available in English, Spanish, and/or Chinese, as required. ### **ELPAC – The English Language Proficiency Assessments for California**

The ELPAC is the test that will be used to measure how well students in TK through twelfth grade understand English when it is not their primary language. The ELPAC will be administered February 25 – April 12.

# California Assessment of Student Performance and Progress (CAASPP)

The California Assessment of Student Performance and Progress, or CAASPP, is the state academic testing program. CAASPP is a system intended to provide information that can be used to monitor student progress and ensure that all students leave high school ready for college and career. Like last year, CAASPP includes computer-based tests in English language arts, mathematics, and science. Students in grades 3-8 and 11 will take the computer adaptive tests in English and math in spring of 2019. Students in grades 5, 8, and an assigned high school grade will also take the tests in science.

If you would like more information regarding your school's schedule, please contact your school's main office. Following the spring testing, students will receive individual score reports. Student score reports will be electronically distributed to parents/guardians in late summer/early fall and will include an overall score, and description of the student's achievement level for English language arts, mathematics, and science if applicable. Students enrolled in the Spanish Dual Immersion programs at Blacow Elementary School, Grimmer Elementary School, Vallejo Mill Elementary School, or Hopkins Junior High School in grades 3, 4, 6, and 7 will also take the California Spanish Assessment (CSA).

Parents and guardians have the right to exempt their child from taking the CAASPP assessments. If you have any questions or concerns regarding your child's participation, please contact your school's principal.
