

Get to know the Oliveira Specialists

Hi! My name is **Elisabeth Berkson** and this will be my eighth year as **Resource Specialist** at Oliveira and my fifteenth year teaching as a Special Education Specialist. I work with students in kindergarten through sixth grade on their academic and behavioral IEP goals. Here at Oliveira the Resource program is both push-in (where I work in the classroom with the students who have already qualified for Resource, pulling a small group or walking around to support students) and pull-out (where I take a student or students to my class to work on a skill, reteach the lesson, or work on IEP goals). I also do the academic assessment for students who are being assessed for Special Services as part of the IEP team and work to keep all paperwork in compliance with Special Education law. **Mrs. Debbie Afana** is another **Resource Specialist** that works part-time at Oliveira. She is a long-time member of the Oliveira Community and also works part-time at Brookvale. **Mrs. Angie Cory**, an amazing para-educator, also works with the students with Resource services. This is her ninth year as part of the Oliveira community. We are excited to start the new school year!

Hello Oliveira students and families and friends! I am **Ms. Althea Rahman, Oliveira's music teacher**, and I'm excited to be beginning my 8th year at Oliveira. I've been a musician for most of my life, with a background in vocal and instrumental music. I've specialized in music education using the Kodaly philosophy and oboe performance. In music class, I use folk songs from all over the world, and a variety of instruments, games and activities to teach music. 1st and 2nd graders focus on music literacy, theory and percussion performance. In 3rd grade and up, we learn to play recorders, and later ukuleles, as we continue our music education. Any student 3rd grade and over can join the Oliveira Glee Club, an after-school vocal ensemble, which is a lot of fun. Hello Oliveira Family and Community,

We are looking forward to another exciting year of physical education at Oliveira. In physical education, we find it important to teach the whole child. Thus, we challenge our students in the physical, mental, and affective (emotional) domain. At the end of the year, we want our students to walk away more physically fit, with the mental knowledge on how to problem solve and strategize in a physical education setting, and also like our students to have the ability to work cooperatively with others in a group setting.

Our students will be active in a wide variety of physical education activities. Most units will be taught in a -part-whole teaching manner. Meaning, we instruct the activity as a whole, break down the activity into the required skills necessary, and then bring the activity back into a more recreational setting. Throughout most units, our students will be assessed on their physical, mental, or affective domain. In addition, our students' fitness levels will be assessed utilizing the FitnessGram Assessment.

In physical education, we share Oliveira's school-wide goal of respect, responsibility, and resourcefulness. In all programs, the students are encouraged and expected to demonstrate this positive behavior before, during, and after school. Two of the after school programs that Oliveira provides is Sharks and Parks and Boys/Girls Basketball (competitive team). Students will receive additional information on these two programs at a later time.

Parents can help students succeed in physical education by sending them to school in proper athletic footwear and please make sure students can tie their shoes, if they have laces. If possible, please send a water bottle with your child to use during their physical education classes; hydration is necessary during physical activity. We are looking forward to another great year for our Soaring Eagles.

OLIVEIRA SCHOOL LIBRARY POLICIES

2018/2019 School Year

DEAR PARENTS/FAMILIES OF ALL OLIVEIRA STUDENTS:

We at Oliveira Elementary believe that reading is the key to vocabulary development and full literacy. Our programs this year will include motivating all our students to read and enjoy literature. We hope you can join our parent volunteers as we support our children in this effort. Watch for more information in our newsletters.

Your student will soon be visiting our school library with his/her class. Your child will be checking out books weekly. Books are checked out for 1 week at a time and returned or renewed during regular class library time. (We hope we can have students borrow 2-3 books at a time.)

You can help your student by:

- Finding a good place in your home to read. Good lighting and comfortable surroundings are important considerations.
- Helping your student find a safe place (**out of reach of little brothers and sisters or pets**) for the library book(s).
- Enjoying books with your child. Encourage your child to read parts of the story to you and discuss the story together.
- Helping your child during oral reading with proper names and uncommon words.
- Reading for your own enjoyment, setting an example for your children.
- Encouraging your child to follow library rules. Rules are posted in the library.

It is the responsibility of each student and his/her family to pay the replacement cost of any lost or damaged (beyond repair) books or the repair cost of damage in excess of normal wear-and-tear. Send any books that are accidentally damaged to the school librarian for repair. PLEASE DO NOT ATTEMPT TO MEND LIBRARY BOOKS WITH TAPE OR MATERIALS FROM HOME. Our Library Media Technician has special materials for this purpose.

REPLACEMENT COSTS: Paperback books \$15 / Hardcover books \$30
