- Make attendance your number one priority. Let your child know that unless they are sick, they must attend school (and be on time.) Make a strong effort to schedule appointments after school hours.
- Show you care. Talk about school activities and projects. Make an effort to attend school events.
- Remain positive. Try to set a positive example for your child, even when your own day has been challenging. If you show a positive attitude about your work, your child may feel better about their own.
- Encourage your child to show gratitude to those who work hard to educate now & ensure future success.

As we move closer to the 2nd Trimester Report Card, educators are often asked one important question, “What do you think I can do at home to help my child be more successful at school?” My answer is very simple, “Read with your child every day. Let them see you read.” Before, during, and after the reading, encourage your child, begin a discussion about the story, ask questions, visualize the story, offer information, share personal thoughts, and connect the story to real-life situations. Make the time an enjoyable experience and let your child see that reading is fun. Celebrate this special time together!

If you are applying to be a study trip driver chaperone or overnight chaperone, the forms needed are in the Resources Tab in the CiviCore portal. Approvals are emailed to the volunteer from the CiviCore system, so be sure to check your email (maybe spam folder) for updates.

Oliveira has already had volunteers use the system to be approved to be a study trip driver, a study trip chaperone or a classroom volunteer—applying is easy so don't delay.

Problem Solving is the Trait of the Month

Parents & Guardians can support Oliveira staff and students by talking about the below to extend Problem Solving skills into our homes and community.

Definition: Finding solutions, identify, define, explore, evaluate, recommend

Synonyms: Remedy, cure, compromise, solution, fix

Home Connection: Help your child walk through the problem solving steps. Offer guidance if needed, but encourage your child to solve it on their own.

1. Identify the problem.
2. Develop at least three possible solutions.
3. Identify pros (positives) and cons (negatives) of each solution.
4. Pick a solution.
5. Test it out.

Immunization Requirements for 7th Grade

Whooping cough, also known as pertussis, continues to be widespread in California. To help stop its spread, all students entering 7th grade are required by law to have proof of a whooping cough booster (Tdap) shot. Requirements for MMR and Varicella have been updated as well. Make an after-school immunization appointment with your health care provider and ask your health care provider if your student has the required shots for school for 20-21. Bring the updated record to the office so the immunizations can be entered into FUSD's computer for review before the 2020-2021 School Year.

Oliveira has 34.65% of 6th Grade students compliant as of 3/2/2020—Parents & Guardians—turn in records as soon as possible!
