2019-2020 School Year Enrollment Update

Enrollment for new students for the 2019-2020 school year has begun. Now that the priority period has passed, all other New TK-6th grade enrollments began April 1, 2019. Please refer to the Fremont Unified School District web site (www.fremont.k12.ca.us) under Enrollment for more information, timelines and instructions.

—If you move over the summer, be sure to submit a new Residency Verification form and the required documents to Student Support Services (open Monday—Thursday, closed July 4th).

Attendance on the First Day of School

The 2019-20 School Year starts on Weds., August 28, 2019. All students are expected to report to school on the first day, Weds. 8/28/19. Students who have not attended on the first day of school will be dropped at the end of the first day of school. Students who are dropped will not be guaranteed a seat at the school and may have to be overloaded to other schools upon return. The only exceptions will be students who are absent due to illness. If a student is absent the first day due to illness, parent/guardian must notify the school every day the student is absent. **Seats will not be held for students on extended vacation or other optional activities, whether or not the school is notified.** (AR5113.1).

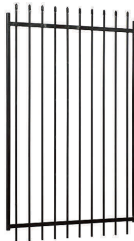

Duck Stamp Contest

Prisha P. Grade 4 student of Oliveira Elementary School, Fremont CA was awarded the 3rd place for her creation of a green-winged Teal duck in crayons, from over 2500 entries for 2019-2020 California Federal Duck Stamp Design Contest, conducted by the US Fish and Wildlife Services.

The Federal Junior Duck Stamp Conservation and Design Program is a dynamic art- and science-based curriculum that teaches wetland and waterfowl conservation to students in kindergarten through high school. The program encourages students to explore their natural world, invites them to investigate biology and wildlife management principles and challenges them to express and share what they have learned with others.

The winning artwork, selected from entries all over the 50 states serves as the design for the \$5 Junior Duck Stamp, which the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service produces annually.

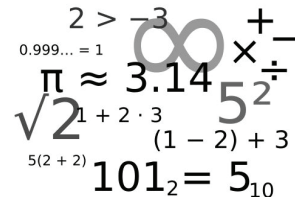
Prisha's artwork, along with all the winning artworks will be displayed in various Wildlife Refuge events across California throughout the year and included in their annual calendar.

Volunteers Needed for the 19-20 School Year

School Site Council

The purpose of School Site Council (SSC) is to oversee the school programs that include the curriculum and best instructional practices. SSC, made up of the principal, parents, and teachers, ensures that the needs of every Oliveira student is met. The SSC monitors the Single Plan for Student Achievement (SPSA) Plan. This group also oversees the spending of certain funds provided through LCAP. SSC is made up of an equal number of parents and staff. Parents are elected by parents, and staff by the staff. These members represent the entire school community.

SPSA: Single Plan for Student Achievement:

This plan is developed to make sure there is ongoing improvement of our school. The plan is written specifically for Oliveira on an annual basis to reflect the needs of all of our current students. It is available on the district website.

SSC meetings take place 5-6 times per school year. An agenda for each meeting will be posted on the website and on the office window the at least 72 hours before the meeting date. **All meetings are open to the public.**

English Learner Advisory Committee (ELAC)

Each California Public School from Kindergarten through grade 12, with 21 or more English learners, must form a functional English Learner Advisory Committee (ELAC). The purpose of the ELAC is to advocate for student English Learners and advise the principal and school staff on programs and services for English learners and the School Site Council on the development of the *SPSA*. The school's program for English learners, including, the school's needs assessment, reviewing the school's annual language census, and makes efforts to increase parents awareness of the importance of regular school attendance. The committee may elect at least one member to the District English Learner Advisory Committee (DELAC). Contact Mrs. Anderson at the Oliveira Office to let her know you want to be part of the TEAM!

Safety Committee (SC)

Oliveira has a **Safety Committee (SC)** made up of administrators, teachers, classified staff and parents which examines facility issues to ensure a safe campus. Oliveira also has a safety plan, disaster preparedness plan, and a crisis team. The SC conducts periodic fire, lock-down, earthquake, and disaster drills in accordance with California State Education Codes. Each school's Safety Plan is posted on their website. Oliveira's SSC is responsible for developing the school site safety plan or for delegating the responsibility to Oliveira's safety planning committee. Ed.Code 35294.1. Join Oliveira's "Safety Committee" now and support a safe academic and working environment for all. Call Mr. Downing at the Oliveira Office to let him know you want to be a part of the TEAM!

Oliveira Ambassador Council

Oliveira's student Oliveira Ambassador Council (OAC) promotes and maintains school spirit, organizes student related activities, develops leadership skills, and supports other programs for all students at Oliveira Elementary School. OAC Membership is by teacher recommendation, and usually begins meeting in October.

If you're not available yourself, please encourage others you know who may be able to help us out at lunchtime. We would love to have qualified parents, grandparents, aunts, uncles, friends, and neighbors helping to supervise Oliveira students while they eat and play safely.

Help your child prevent that "Summer Slide"...."Summer Slide" is losing some of the valuable learning that took place this year.

Here are **ten things** that you can do to help prevent the summer slide:

1. Read EVERY day! Read non-fiction, fiction, ebooks, poetry, newspapers and read out loud! For most children, twenty minutes is an appropriate amount of time to read for a child who is an independent reader. Most libraries have a wonderful summer reading program with incentives and rewards for books read over the summer.
2. Cook with your children. This is one of the best ways to integrate math, reading and following directions. Let your child design the menu too! Help your child put together their favorite recipes in a cookbook.
3. Plant a garden. Your child will gain responsibility and pride as they watch their plants grow and thrive.
4. Take a field trip to a museum, zoo or local park with walking trails. Keep a journal about your travels.
5. Learn a new word each week! Hang it on the fridge and see who can use it the most times throughout the week.
6. Enroll in a quality summer program that will provide your child with opportunities to build their critical thinking skills.
7. Play quick games with flashcards like Math War or Concentration to keep math skills sharp.
8. Listen to Audio Books during your road trip.
9. Take pictures and make a summer scrapbook.
10. Did I mention **READ?! If your child does nothing else this summer make sure he/she is reading!**
