THE EMOTIONAL CUP

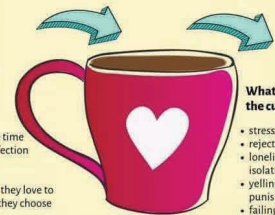
Imagine that every child has a cup that needs to be filled—with affection, love, security, and attention. Some seem to have a full cup most of the time, or know good ways to get a refill. But most children get a little nervous when their cup gets near empty.

Some ways that children deal with having an empty cup:

- steal from other people's cups
- misbehave to get your attention and show that they need a refill
- seem to have bottomless cups, or need constant 'topping off'
- can't sit still for refills or actively refuse them
- bounce off the walls when they approach 'empty'
- think they have to fight or compete for every refill

What fills a child's cup:

- play
- friendship
- one-on-one time
- love and affection
- connection
- succeeding
- doing what they love to do or what they choose to do



What empties the cup:

- stress and strain
- rejection by peers
- loneliness and isolation
- yelling and punishment
- failing
- fatigue
- doing what they're forced to do or they hate to do

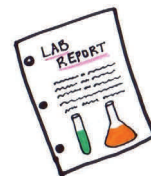
2019 Science and Engineering Fair

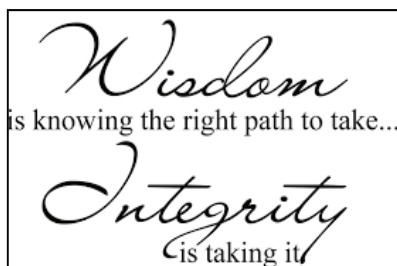

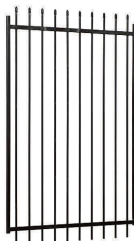

Information from Fremont Unified School District

2019-2020 School Year Enrollment Update Enrollment for new students for the 2019-2020 school year has begun. Now that the priority period has passed, all other New TK-6th grade enrollments began April 1, 2019. Please refer to the Fremont Unified School District web site (www.fremont.k12.ca.us) under Enrollment for more information, timelines and instructions.

—If you move over the summer, be sure to submit a new Residency Verification form and the required documents to Student Support Services (open Monday—Thursday, closed July 4th).

Attendance on the First Day of School

The 2019-20 School Year starts on Weds., August 28, 2019. All students are expected to report to school on the first day, Weds. 8/28/19. Students who have not attended on the first day of school will be dropped at the end of the first day of school. Students who are dropped will not be guaranteed a seat at the school and may have to be overloaded to other schools upon return. The only exceptions will be students who are absent due to illness. If a student is absent the first day due to illness, parent/guardian must notify the school every day the student is absent. **Seats will not be held for students on extended vacation or other optional activities, whether or not the school is notified.** (AR5113.1).
