#### Rules of Chess by Evelyn Huang

Chess is played on a 64 square board, with 32 light, and 32 dark. Each player plays either white, or black, and controls 16 pieces of their color. White always starts the game, and opponents take turns to move a piece. To win, you have to checkmate the king. That means to attack the king, in a way that the opponent cannot do anything to prevent it. Each piece captures in the same way as it moves, except for the pawn. Here are the basic rules of chess and how the pieces act.

**Pawn**- Pawns can only move forward one step at a time and cannot move backward. They capture pieces diagonally one square in front of them. On the first move, they can choose to move two squares forward. If they reach the end of the board, they can promote, or change, into another piece of their choice(except the king). A player starts with 8 of them. They are worth 1 point.

**Knight**- Knights move in little "L"s. When they move 2 squares up or down, they then move one square to the left or right. If they move 2 squares left or right, they then move one square up or down. Knights are the only pieces that are able to jump over other pieces. A player starts with 2 of them. They are worth 3 points.

**Bishop**- Bishops can move diagonally as far as they can reach before being blocked by a piece, or the edge of the board. You start with a light-squared bishop and a dark-squared bishop. They are also worth 3 points.

**Rook**- Rooks can move up, down, left, or right as far as they can reach before being blocked by a piece, or the edge of the board. A player starts with 2 of them. They are worth 5 points.

**Queen**- The Queen is the most powerful piece. To put it simply, they act like a Bishop and a Rook combined. They move up, right, down, left, and diagonally as far as they can reach before being blocked by a piece, or the edge of the board. A player starts with 1 of them. They are worth 9 points.

**King**- The King is the most important piece in the game. They move in any direction but only one square at a time. The king can castle, or move 2 squares towards the rook, and the rook jumps over. This can only happen when the king and the rook involved have not moved yet. A player starts with 1 of them. They are not worth anything, since you cannot capture a king.

-The following rules will always end in a draw-

**Stalemate**- When a player has no legal moves but isn't in check

Threefold repetition - When the same position repeats 3 times in a game

50 move rule - When 50 moves go by without a capture or pawn move

Now you know the rules of chess! You can play over the board with friends and family, or play online through the super dark and scary internet!



#### How to succeed in YouTube

So, you want to go viral on YouTube? Researchers say about 30 percent of kids want to be a YouTuber when they grow up. My YouTube channel isn't that big, but I believe I can still help you. To get views, there are three main things that are needed to make a video viral: recommendations, good title and thumbnail, and, of course, an engaging video. I'll separate all of these into separate paragraphs, so you can skip around as you wish.

First thing is the video. You need to find what you want to do. You also want to make it consistent, (this is the most important as you will get long term subscribers, but you can also mix it up) so if you play Minecraft in one video, you should play that or other games in another video. Once you find what you want to make, it's time to make it. It's important to choose the right tools to make a high quality video. For video editing software, choose Davinci Resolve. It's free, has everything you need, and if you want to go advanced it has an optimized workflow to make videos faster and has things that are used in movies. If you can, you may also buy the paid version. There's also softwares such as voice changers and higher quality video recorders (most built-in recorders aren't high quality), and you might want things like cameras. For constructing the video, you need to keep your watchers engaged. You can add comedic moments or, if you're doing video games, you can sort of make a story where you, the main character, has to beat the game. You can watch other popular videos to see what makes you keep watching.

Now, you need to make a good title and thumbnail. You want your video to actually be clicked so you can get views. Some people try to take advantage of this by doing something called 'clickbait', which is lying in your titles and thumbnails to get views. You shouldn't do anything like this other than a small exaggeration, because clicking on the video won't get you anything if you don't have enough watchtime. You could try to clickbait with shorts since they're, well short, but people will probably stop watching your videos after they see a few. Try to make the titles interesting, and the thumbnail eye-catching. After all, people will probably be scrolling through dozens of boring, unsaturated thumbnails. As with video creation, a good thing to do is find videos you watched and see what made you want to click it.

Finally, there's the recommendations. If people can't get the option to see your video, how will they see it? You basically just have to put keywords in your titles that match with trends, and it will get recommended. You can add tags too, but you mostly just have to get something people care about, and it will eventually come on YouTube's front page. It comes down to what your video is about. Another thing you can do is promote on other social media or some other method. I haven't figured out any big secrets, so that's all I have for recommendations.


As a top-level carnivore, the big cat helps maintain a diversity of species by regulating prey numbers and competing with other, smaller carnivores. Jaguars are also important in human culture, frequently playing a central role in stories, songs and prayers of indigenous people. Yet today, jaguars have been almost eliminated from the United States and populations in Central and South America are falling because of habitat destruction, trophy hunting and conflict with humans.

A Splendid poison frog is a wonderfully named creature that is one of three Central American frog species to have been newly declared extinct.

There is only a pair of the Northern White Rhino left – two females, Najin and her daughter Fatu – meaning another member of their species will never naturally reproduce. Barring a scientific miracle, it is just a waiting game before they go extinct.

The smooth handfish, declared extinct this year, was the first marine species to be declared extinct in modern times, unfortunately showing that even the seafloor is not safe from the extinction crisis.

#### Claudio Arrau

Claudio was a Chilean pianist born in February 1903 and died in June 1991. At a very early age, Arrau was told to learn piano from his mother who was a piano teacher. At 10, he was sent to Berlin by the Chilean government and got enrolled into a school of music. This helped Arrau early on to continue learning his future job. When Arrau was 11, he was able to play the song F. Liszt, which was known to be the hardest, most difficult song to play on the piano. He was awarded with the grand prix and toured in the soviet union in both 1929 and 1930. This was a big accomplishment for Arrau and will still be today. Still, there is much more to learn about him and his journey becoming a famous musician

#### Josef Hofmann

Hofmann was born in January 1876 and died 1957. He was well known for being in a concert or orchestra at the age of 6. At the age of 11, Hofmann toured the U.S. In the years 1926–1938, he became the director of the 'Curtis institute of music' and continued playing the piano. His piano playing was considered "poetic" or "free" meaning his music was calm and creative. He composed for a symphony, piano concert, solo piano music, and published 3 books about playing the piano. Sadly, his death was a horrible day, but even so, many people still remember him to this day. Every pianist is unique in their own way no matter what.

#### **Inside The Iphone**

Everyone is familiar with an Iphone. The small rectangular object you can keep in your pocket. The device you wield to contact others, watch videos, and many other things. But how does this beeping, whooshing, clicking device actually work and how did it start out? What makes the screen light up or the touch screen operate? Discovering how this creation really functions may shock you. It might be more complicated than you might think. This is how an Iphone works.

When you touch a phone screen, the image moves, or you type a letter. But how does that even work? When you touch the screen, circuits inside the phone, register your finger and what it is trying to do. It sends the electricity toward your finger and the screen moves. Another way an Iphone detects movement is the pressure you put on your finger. The Iphione senses that pressure causing the circuits to touch and function. But some phones work differently. Some phones sense the light waves around the phone and how other things block it. But some other objects can touch the screen but not move it. What happens then? Some objects can brush against the phone but the phone doesn't sense it. Again, some phones work differently. An Iphone can calculate the amount of pressure the object has but others use the delicate layers of the screen to locate what and where it is.

Newer Iphones make it easier to unlock your device with extra features. Most use fingerprint sensors. Fingerprint sensors open and close your phone with no one else opening it themselves. Since everyone on Earth has a different and unique fingerprint, it makes it safe for you to unlock it. When you place your thumb on the button, electricity is sent from inside of the device only where your finger makes contact. This causes the phone to read your fingerprint, opening the phone.

Whenever you are watching a funny video on your mobile device, you can hear the sound coming from the phone. You can even change the volume on the side. A tiny black box on the right and left of the iPhone releases the sound. When you adjust the volume to your liking, the button sends a signal and increases or decreases the frequency. The electric current from the buttons sends all the way down to the small speakers changing the volume.

An iPhone has endless secrets to it from touch screen to volume. Of course, there are even more functions. All these movements like swiping down or pressing a button on screen happens in a nanosecond. Mobile devices are truly amazing once you realize what happens behind the scenes.

# The Beautiful Bryce Canyon By Aarav

There is a wide range of places to go during summer break, from beaches to snow-covered mountains, but one of my favorites is national parks, and that's why I'd like to tell you about my trip to Bryce Canyon, Utah. In case you didn't know, national parks are scenic or historically significant areas of countryside protected by the federal government for the general public's enjoyment or the preservation of wildlife. They have natural wonders that you most likely wouldn't see anywhere else. In my lifetime, I have gone to many national parks before, but Bryce Canyon takes the cake.

Before telling you about my trip, I'd like to explain some of Bryce Canyon's background and past. Bryce Canyon was named after Ebenezer Bryce, who was the first to build a home in the area in 1874. The park covers 35,835 acres, and has a very interesting legend. This legend was made by a tribe that used to live there long ago, which were called the Pauite. Here is how it goes:

"Before there were any Indians, the Legend People lived in that place. There were many of them. They were of many kinds--birds, animals, lizards and such things, but they looked like people. They were not people. They had the power to make themselves look that way. For some reason the Legend People in that place were bad; they did something that was not good, perhaps a fight, perhaps some stole something...the tale is not clear at this point. Because they were bad, Coyote turned them all into rocks. You can see them in that place now all turned into rocks; some standing in rows, some sitting down, some holding onto others. You can see their faces, with paint on them just as they were before they became rocks. The name of that place is Angka-ku-wass-a-wits (red painted faces)."

These rocks that they describe are known as hoodoos, which are tall, spindly structures that form within sedimentary rock and protrude from the bottom of an arid drainage basin or badland. These are so wondrous because they are formed by erosion, and erosion only. Rain, wind, flowing water, you name it. These forces make Bryce Canyon what it is today. That's why this canyon is famous, and why I love it. Now, onto my trip.

There were many things to do in Bryce, all of which were quite enjoyable. We had to wake up early because some places were seen best at certain times. First, we went to Sunrise point, of course, at Sunrise. The view was breathtaking.

There were many hoodoos scattered about below us, blending in with the pretty green mountains in the background. But best of all, the sun, just coming over the horizon, made the land glow a deep orange.

After that experience, I started to wonder why the land was a reddish-orange color. My mom told me that different sediments combine to make this red stone. More specifically, sandstones, dolostones, limestones, and mudstones. I became fascinated with the formation and started googling facts about Bryce Canyon. Now, don't take me for a nerd, but I eventually learned that the Colorado River that shaped the Grand Canyon also shaped Bryce using erosion! There is one other thing that caused Bryce Canyon to become what it is today. That is the Colorado Plateau uplift. This is when the tectonic plates under the plateau started shifting. This caused the plateau to rise and erode it. But even more surprising is how the hoodoos were formed. Every single hoodoo was about the same height as the plateau, but eventually snow, ice and water eroded the land around it. Every winter, snow would fall on the hoodoos, and would chip away parts of the hoodoos once it melted. Many people said that when they visited Bryce Canyon again a few years later, the hoodoos looked different. That's how fast this land is breaking down.

We moved on, and next, we went to Bryce point, where we saw what people call the amphitheater view. When I looked down, I understood why. The whole ground in front of us was shaped like an amphitheater. There was a "stage" in the middle and hoodoos that looked like people encircled it. This was my favorite place in Bryce Canyon. I couldn't believe this was all formed naturally!

#### Directions to Make The Sugar Scrub:

- 1. Pour all the sugar into the mixing bowl.
- 2. Add ¼ cup olive oil
- 3. Mix all of the ingredients together
- 4. Put the 5-6 drops of essential oil at the end and mix it with the rest of the ingredients.
- 5. Scoop the mixture into your jar
- 6. (Optional) Put a label, ribbon, decorate the bag, put it into the bag, and give it to your mom!

#### How long will the scrub last?

It should last, at least, 2-3 months. If your mom uses it wisely, it might last up to 6 months!

Rubik's puzzles are considered by some as one of the trickiest puzzles out there. In fact, only about 5.3% of people in the world can solve this puzzle. The original puzzle was made by Erno Rubik and other people have taken on the challenge of creating one of these puzzles. As a result of this, there are over 50 different Rubik's puzzles. Let's take a look at some of them.

Traditional 3x3



This cube is probably the most recognizable of the bunch that I am going to cover. This cube can be solved in many ways, the most famous being the Beginner method and CFOP. This cube was created in 1974 and was made by Erno Rubik.

The Rubik's Revenge: 4x4



Also known as the Rubik's Master Cube, the 4x4 cube is also well-known. This one, obviously, is harder than the 3x3. The fastest time that this cube has been solved in is 17.42 seconds. This puzzle, surprisingly, wasn't actually made by Erno Rubik. Instead it was made by Peter Sebesteny. This cube was almost named the Sebesteny cube until a last-minute discussion that changed the name to the Rubik's Revenge to attract fans from the original cube.

#### **Pyraminx**



This is a particularly interesting one. Since it is shaped in a pyramid, it has a very limited set of moves, and there are no middle layer turns from the bottom-up, unlike the 3x3 and somewhat the 4x4. It was made by Uwe Meffert in 1981. This puzzle is the 2nd most popular in the world. The fastest time to solve this is, and get this, 0.91 seconds!

#### Megaminx



This cube has 12 sides. It is a really hard puzzle and can take a few weeks to learn. This puzzle was made 1 year after the pyraminx, and by the same person: Uwe Meffert. The fastest time to solve this cube is 27.22 seconds. It was set by Juan Pablo Huanqui in 2019.

#### Rubik's 2x2



Also referred to as the Pocket cube, this cube was made in 1983, one year after the Megaminx, and was made by Erno Rubik. The current world record for this cube stands at 0.49 seconds. This record was achieved by Maciej Czapiewski in 2016.

Over time, the Rubik's cube has evolved, and has led to many interesting types of puzzles, like the ones we covered today. Thank you for exploring these puzzles with me today.
