(REVIEWED AND ADOPTED BY SCHOOL SITE COUNCIL YEARLY)

This chart is a guideline for most discipline situations. Restorative Practices should be used in communication with students and families at all applicable times. The administrator may utilize discretion when making the final decision.

Engaging in an act of bullying, including but not limited to bullying by means of an electronic act, directed toward another pupil or school personnel.

HATE CRIMES Caused or attempting cause or participate in an act of hate violence. Including but not limited to posting or circulating demeaning jokes, leaflets, or caricatures, defacing, removing or destroying posted materials, distributing or posting hate-group literature and posters, using bigoted insults, taunts, or slurs. THE PRINCIPAL WILL RECOMMEND SUSPENSION OR EXPULSION TO THE BOARD OF EDUCATION

Obscenity/Profanity	Saturday School or Suspension	Suspension 1-3 Days
Off Campus/Loitering in Parking Lot	Saturday School	Progressive Discipline
Parking/Driving Violation: Students are forbidden to park in the staff lot, fire or traffic lane, horseshoe or any of the areas accessed by the service entrance (near C-120), E-wing, and C-wing. Vehicles parked in these areas will be subject to ticketing/ towing/school consequences.		
Physical/Verbal Abuse of Staff	Suspension/Expulsion	
Sexual Harassment: A pupil in grades 4-12 may be suspended and recommended for expulsion for committing sexual harassment.		
TARDIES: Parents/students will be notified of patterns of excessive tardies. Teacher notifies parent and may assign class detention after 3 tardies to a class. On 11 th tardy, administrator will assign tardy contract/Saturday School . Tardiness beyond 30 min. or failure to check out of school is a class cut which may result in Saturday School.
