III. Principal Report (Mr. Moran)

 Construction Plan for Campus--Board approved a \$13 million, 2-story building that will provide 12 classrooms. Project is supposed to be completed by the 2018-2019 school year.

- Safety--Safety meeting planned for next week. Three teachers & some ASB students have organized and labeled everything in the container.
- ELL--WHS will pilot the new English Language Proficiency Assessment for California (ELPAC) test. All students, including ELLs are in the process of taking the district ELA benchmark test.
- Technology--Cafeteria speakers being replaced. There is an anticipated dip in funding for the next school year. WHS will rely heavily on donations for updating technology and repairing/replacing laptops & Chromebooks in mobile carts.
- WASC Action Plan Committee--There are still a few LCAP funds that
 administration would like to use to do more Career and College promotion, such
 as presenters and activities for students. WHS's Emotional Intelligence
 committee will be distributing a survey to the entire student body. We will then
 have data on all our kids. The El committee is also adopting the Ruler Program,
 which stands for:

Recognizing emotions in self and others

Understanding the causes and consequences of emotion

Labeling emotions accurately

Expressing emotions appropriately

Regulating emotions effectively

The program has a mobile app in which students can track emotions as well.

 Writing Task Force--For the past couple years, the CLEAR (Claim, Evidence, Analysis, Relevance) paragraph was emphasized for persuasive writing. This year they have also added effective reading strategies because reading and writing are so intertwined. Both are being promoted campuswide.

IV. <u>Budget Presentation/Approval</u> (EL, LCAP, Title III, Donations Account)

Bob Moran discussed the need to move \$2500 from the 1000 series LCAP funds to the 5000 series Intervention funds to pay for the Facing History and Ourselves Holocaust program. This program, which is also aligned with our El goals, includes having a Holocaust survivor that presents for students. Holly LaBarbera made a motion to approve the budget change.
