

California College Promise Grant (Former BOGW)

- To help eligible students cover the cost of classes -Enrollment Fees - for the academic year
- Apply by submitting FAFSA/ CA DREAM ACT
- Has an income ceiling

California College Promise Free Tuition and Book Grant Program – AB 19 & AB 2

- AB19 (First Year students) and AB2 (Second Year students) for full time students to help cover enrollment fees and other mandatory fees for the Fall/Spring semesters.
- Must complete a FAFSA or Dream Act Application
- Must be making Satisfactory Academic Progress
- AB2 grant eligibility is based on having 24 units completed the first year. It's also based on funding which is a first-come, first serve basis.

Ohlone College Promise Scholarship

- pays for required tuition, books, and enrollment fees for two years at Ohlone
- Ohlone College Specific
- Only students in the Tri-City Area can apply

Enrollment Process

Apply to Ohlone College

Create MyOhlone Account

Complete Orientation and Placement

Register For A Counseling And Registration (CAR) Session

Accept your Financial Aid

Submit both CCC Apply and Ohlone College Application.

In 2-3 days you will receive an email from Ohlone with your Ohlone Student ID. Take note of this id number and refer back to this orientation process to proceed with next steps.

Using your Ohlone student ID, create your **MyOhlone**_account.

MyOhlone will be used for several tasks including:

- Accessing your Ohlone student email
- Complete Orientation & Placement Module
- Register for classes

<u>Orientation</u> is an important part of the Onboarding process.

After completing the Orientation and Placement Module, you will be automatically directed to complete the self-guided Math and English module.

What information is covered in an Counseling and Registration (CAR) Session?

- Receive group advising for first semester classes with a counselor
- Overview of student services, including Counseling and Special Programs
- Academic Standards
- Time Management skills
- Overview of Certificate, Degree, and Transfer information
- Financial Aid and Scholarship resources
- Review of Academic Calendar

After submitting your FAFSA or CA Dream Act AND have applied to Ohlone College, you can review and accept your financial aid via our FA self service account.
